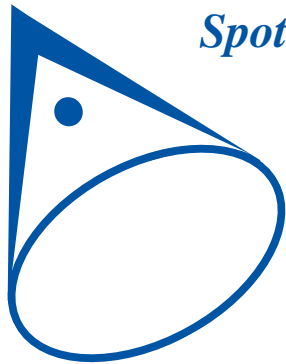

Spotlight On

Dr. Robert Iadeluca

Dr. Robert (Robby) Iadeluca was born on September 25, 1920 and graduated from Islip, Long Island High School in 1937. He played violin and trumpet, soloed in boys choir, wrote essays and poems, played outfield in baseball. He reached Life rank in Boy Scouts and became Asst Scoutmaster. After graduation “Dr. Robby” joined largest advertising agency in world in NYC, a real “Mad Man,” and also became a commercial photographer. He left to enlist in infantry during World War II and became a First Sergeant. He fought in France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany, then returned to study at Hofstra College under GI Bill and received BA in Psychology. He also became Scoutmaster and returned to the advertising agency but this time in the research department.

Dr. Robby became a Scout Executive organizing Scout troops and training Scoutmasters – during that career became Director Public Relations for five Scout Councils in NYC. Then he moved to field of education and became Asst. Dir Public Relations for New York State Dept of Education in Albany, however the recession caused state legislature to tighten budget resulting in unemployment and at age

52 attended State University Albany then transferred to Syracuse University receiving a PhD in Life Span Developmental Psychology at age 59 – hired by Army Research Institute for Behavioral Sciences at Pentagon as Research Psychologist at age 61 – retired at age 70.

Became bored after two months and was accepted as an intern in addiction unit at Blue Ridge Hospital (University of VA) for 18 months. He ultimately received state certification and started practice on Hospital Hill in Warrenton as substance abuse counselor and studied for state license and started practicing as clinical psychologist at age 72. He received a diploma in psychopharmacology and is certified hypnotherapist. Dr. Robby specializes in substance abuse and allied depression, anxiety, bipolar, chronic pain and relationship problems and has been practicing in same office for 18 years.

Dr. Robby is a member of both the Fauquier Chamber of Commerce and Greater Warrenton Chamber of Commerce and a former public relations director for Fauquier Community Theatre. He is also a member of the Board of Directors for the Virginia Psychological Association and the Hospice of the Rapidan. For 12 years he has been an active Discussion Leader in an online book group and was an active ballroom dancer but as the body declines better understands the meaning of the term "slow" dancing. He is now interested in creating a local center dedicated to teaching "older" citizens the intricacies of the computer.

August Featured Speaker—Congressman Rob Wittman

Rob Wittman was first elected to serve the 1st Congressional District of Virginia - America's First District - in December of 2007. He was re-elected for his first full-term in the House of Representatives on November 4, 2008. For more than 20 years, Rob has served in several levels of government, from Montross Town Council to United States Congress. Rob won his first campaign for public office in 1986 when he was elected to the Montross Town Council, where he served for 10 years, four of them as Mayor. In 1995, Rob was elected to the Westmoreland County Board of Supervisors and was elected its Chairman in 2003. In 2005, voters in the 99th Legislative District elected Rob to the Virginia House of Delegates, where he served until he was elected to the United States House of Representatives in 2007.

In the U.S. Congress, Rob serves on the House Armed Services Committee and the Committee on Natural Resources, where he is well-positioned to represent the needs of Virginia's First District. He has quickly earned a reputation for being an advocate for our men and women in uniform and for being a champion of the Chesapeake Bay.

On the Armed Services Committee, Rob serves as the Ranking Member of the Oversight and Investigations Subcommittee, and on the Subcommittees on Readiness and Seapower and Expeditionary Forces. In addition, as Co-Chair of the Congressional Shipbuilding Caucus, he is a staunch advocate for a robust Naval fleet and a healthy domestic shipbuilding industry.

Rob is also an invaluable Member of the Committee on Natural Resources, to which he brings his professional expertise in water quality, fisheries, and other natural resource issues. He is a champion of the Chesapeake Bay -- for its environmental and

economic attributes -- and has introduced legislation that will increase the accountability and effectiveness of cleaning up the Bay.

He holds a Ph.D. in Public Policy and Administration from Virginia Commonwealth University, a Master of Public Health degree in Health Policy and Administration from the University of North Carolina, and a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from Virginia Tech.

SFBOA President **Lynne Richman Cox** has been named Executive Director for the **Allegro Community School of the Arts**. **Lynne** assumed leadership responsibilities from Allegro's founder Cynthia Romero on Monday, August 9. **Allegro** offers private music lessons, instrumental ensemble classes, dance, both ballet and modern, and art classes. The **SFBOA** will be submitting a response to the Fauquier County Board of Supervisors about the Targeted Business Review Process (TBRP) proposed by the **Fauquier County Department of Economic Development**. The response will address far greater organizational effectiveness challenges that contribute to the currently sluggish, costly and unfriendly culture of the existing system. The Balanced Growth Alliance will also present its response to the proposed TBRP.
