With over 300 staff members, the company continues to grow in the business of information distribution, both in print and web publishing. Steeped in over 200 years of local newspaper history, the company has grown by staying focused on its core mission of local, local news. Award-winning coverage of distinct communities throughout the region has served the company well. This unwavering devotion to high quality community news has carved a place in the hearts and minds of local readers and advertisers.

In 1963, the company founder, Arthur Arundel, purchased the 165-year-old Loudoun Times-Mirror in Leesburg, VA. The company has been an innovative pioneer in American community journalism ever since.

Today the company is run by the founder's son, Peter Arundel, who worked in politics and CBS News radio before joining the family company. He served in every department of the company before becoming president and chief executive officer.

Under Peter's leadership the company has grown rapidly in the past decade. In this time, the company has started or acquired newspapers in Fairfax, Culpeper and Prince William counties, launched the websites, founded the national advertising division and expanded print offerings to an annual calendar of over 50 niche publications.

The company is very civic-minded, lending meaning to the word "community" in the company name. Newspaper staff takes part in dozens of local causes supporting community development, specifically focused on education and youth charities. The company has established scholarships for local students and actively pursues its mission of improving literacy and education in every community they serve.

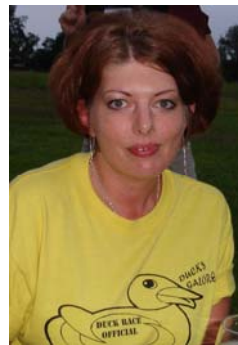
Cows-N-Corn
